Sub: Grant of Permission to Government Employees to join Civil Defence Services: Reiteration of Instructions

Sir,

I am directed to invite your kind attention to the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India (Directorate General of Civil Defence) Letter No. 2/1/66-DGCD-II(i) dated 15.01.1966 (Copy enclosed), wherein Central Government employees were authorized to join the Civil Defence Organisation.

- 2. It was stipulated therein that the period of absence of Government employees while performing duties and functions in Civil Defence services during office hours would be treated as *special casual leave*.
- 3. As part of the ongoing national initiative to rejuvenate and expand Civil Defence preparedness across the country, it is considered essential to mobilize trained manpower from all segments of society, including State or Union Territory Government employees and those working in State or Union Territory Public Sector Undertakings. Accordingly, it is reiterated that States or Union Territories may kindly ensure:
 - (a) Wide circulation of the above instructions among all State Government employees and Public Sector undertakings.
 - (b) Encourage interested employees to enrol as Civil Defence volunteers.
 - (c) Grant of special casual leave to employees when they are called upon to discharge Civil Defence duties or attend training.
- 4. This measure will not only strengthen the volunteer base of Civil Defence but will also enhance the State Government's first-response capacity in emergencies,

disasters & hostile situations and will go a long way in achieving the national goal of building a well-prepared and resilient Civil Defence system.

2. As far as possible it be envisaged that the regular period of training will be outside office hours. However, if in an emergency, A Government seryont who is enrolled as a member of the Civil Defence Service, is required under the Civil Defence Service Rules, 1962 to perform any Autics and function during office hours, the period of Sabsence shall be treated as special casual leave. The Government scryant concerned may also be permitted receive in addition to tein scryal pay, such allowences as may be prescribed for them under the Civil Defence Service Rules, 1962.

3. These orders are not applicable to Government servants desiring to join Civil Defence Organisation on a whole time paid basis. Such Government servants would be sent on deputation basis if they are permonent, and other individual case should be examined on its merits

4. As regards employees of Semi-Governments Organisations and Public Undertakings , the Ministry of Finance etc. are requested if there is no objection to take action on the above lines in respect of the undertakings under their control.

5. In so far as persons serving the Indian Audit and Accounts
Departments are concerned, these orders are issued in consultation with the Comprtoller and Auditor General of India.

The undersigned is directed to refer to this Ministry's O.M. No. 2/7/68-DGCD (CD) dated the 29th October, 1968 and to say that clarification has been sought whether the orders regarding payment of out-of-pocket allowance and grant of special casual leave contain into this Office Memorandum, are also applicable to Government employees on the work charges establishment or to the employees paid from contingencies etc. Out of pocket allowance for Civil Defence Volunteers in sought in the nature of pay of renumeration for the service rendered by Civil Defence Volunteers but is Government's contribution toward out-of-pocket expenses which these volunteers incur while on Civil Defence duty or training. It is, therefore suggested that, as far as possible, the employees paid from contingencies should be deprived of their salary which they would have drawn, but for their call out for Civil Defence Duty.

- 2. The contingency paid staff are not entitled to any leave, but they can be allowed casual leave. If no extra expenditure is involved to Government, therefore special casual leave which is just the ordinary casual leave, can be granted to contingency paid staff for Civil Defence duty if the condition mentioned above is fullfed.
